YouthWorks Host Work Readiness Workshop

YouthWorks, in partnership with the Disability Employment Initiative (DEI), hosted a work readiness workshop on February 27th at The Holiday Inn in Bridgeport. The DEI aims to improve training, education and employment opportunities for youth and adults with disabilities. The workshop provided participants with skills to enhance their job search, work readiness techniques and featured a wellness portion hosted by Alejandra Hochstedler, of Stamford Clinical Services LLC.

Alejandra is a certified clinical psychologist and cognitive behavior group facilitator. She focused the wellness portion of the workshop on self esteem and worked with the participants on how to turn negative thoughts into positive thoughts to help boost their confidence when doing job search and interviews. Participants also heard from Tony Tozzi, from the Boys and Girls Club of Bridgeport. Tony has hired youth during YouthWorks Summer Earn and Learn Program and spoke to the participants about what he looks for when hiring youth and the importance of staying focused and showing up on time.



We Need You! YouthWorks Earn and Learn Program Seeking Summer Worksites

YouthWorks 2020 Earn and Learn Summer Youth Program provides an intensive hands-on career exploration experience for youth ages 16 to 21. Participants complete a work place readiness training to ensure they know what is expected in professional work environments. Participants are then placed at an employer worksite for 20 hours per-week for seven weeks in July and August. The summer youth program is critical to providing our emerging workforce with the skills they need to create a successful future.

Hosting a YouthWorks participant comes at no-cost to employers as the program provides wage subsidies for the entirety of the seven-week program.
